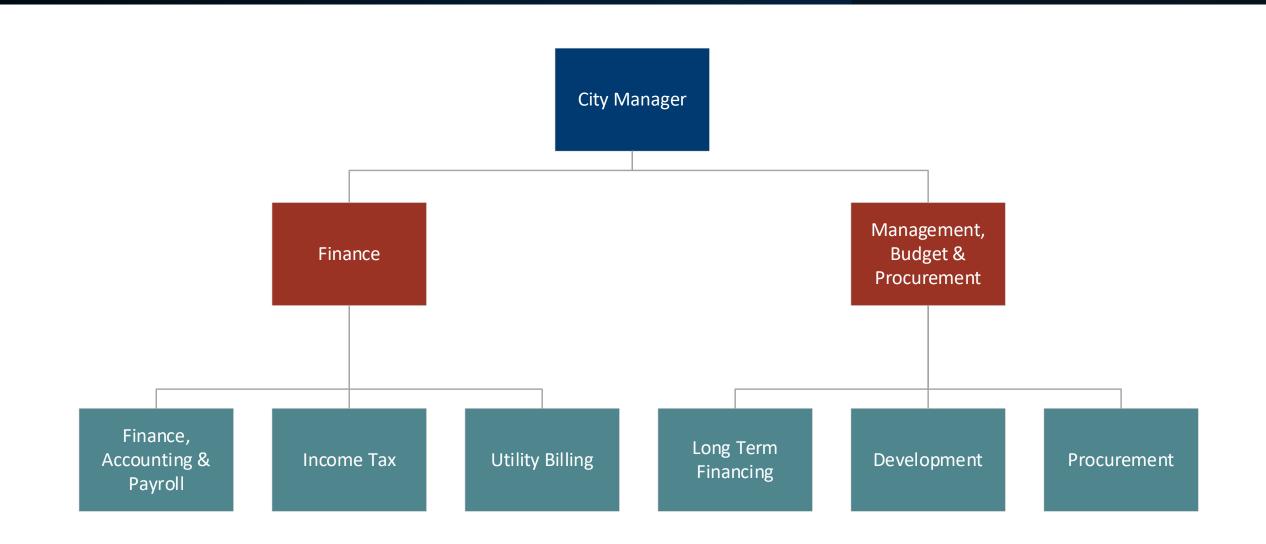

Income Tax



Oversees administration of city income tax including filing & payment

1st city income tax was passed in 1966 at 0.75% Mandatory filing implemented in 1982 eFile offered in 2012



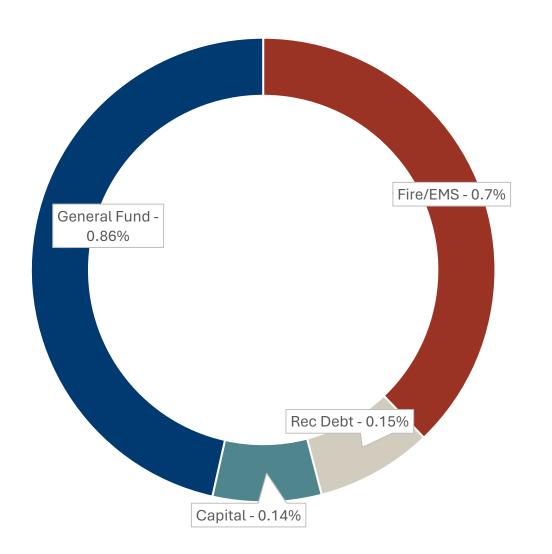
Processes

22,000+ returns
4,400+ withholding accounts



Income tax brings in \$41,235,000 annually

Income Tax Rate



The City has a 1.85% income tax.

- 0.7% for Fire/EMS
- 0.15% for Rec Center Debt
- 1.0% to General Fund
 - 0.14% for Capital Plan
 - 0.86% General Fund Operations

*The 0.14% is not required, but established for budget purposes.



- Includes Water, Wastewater, Stormwater & Refuse
 - 15,000+ utility accounts billed monthly
 - Average 230 move-ins per month
 - Average 200 move-outs per month
 - Up to 500 shut-offs monthly for nonpayment
- Automated reading system implemented in 2016
- New utility bills started in 2024
 - Sorry for the delays!!!
- Brings in about \$21,438,000 annually

Long-Term Financing



Annual Capital Improvement Plan

Covers 5 years

Due to Council by August 15th

Only a plan – not a budget



Annual Operating Budget

Due to Council by November 15th
GFOA Distinguished Budget Award
All appropriations for 2024: \$205M



Cost-Benefit Analysis

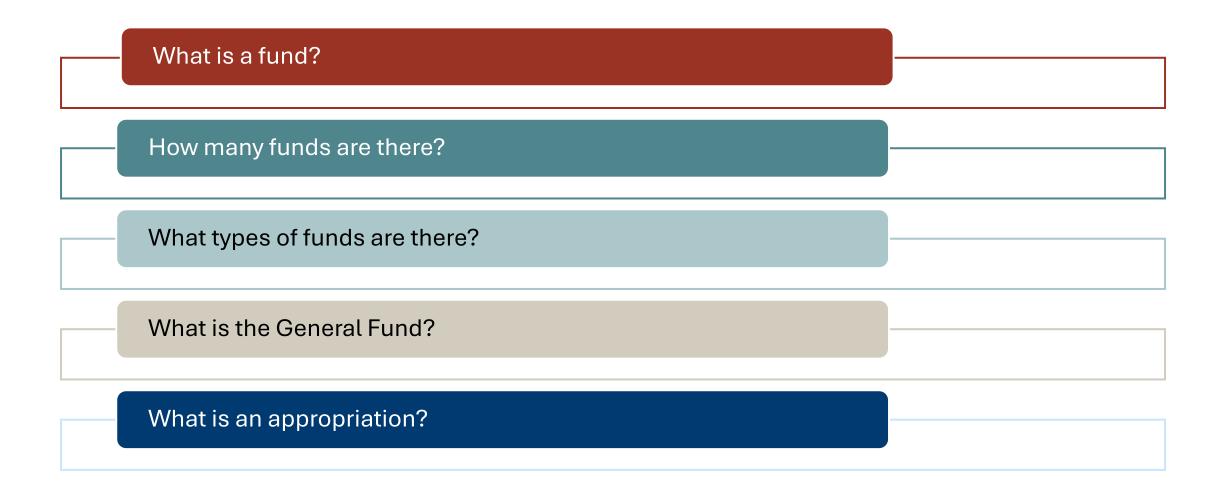
